

**RELATIONS WITH LAW ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITIES
ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE**

The following procedures are intended to guide the involvement of law enforcement authorities in the schools:

- A. Law enforcement officials may enter school premises:
 - 1. In the event of an emergency endangering student or staff safety.
 - 2. At the request of school administrators/designees.
 - 3. In exigent circumstances as authorized by law.

- B. Should a police officer enter the school and ask to speak to or question a student, the school administrator/designee must first request and receive permission from the student's parents/guardians before the officer is allowed to speak with the child. Should the school administrator/designee not gain parental permission, then questioning of the student will not occur on school property.

- C. Law enforcement authorities are responsible for ensuring that a student is informed of his/her rights prior to an interrogation, search or arrest conducted by law enforcement authorities.

- D. A student may be removed from school by law enforcement authorities when there is a court order, an arrest warrant, or when there is a warrantless arrest as authorized by law. School administrators/designees shall notify the student's parents/guardians as soon as possible of the student's removal from school.

- E. School administrators/designees shall release student information to law enforcement authorities only as allowed by the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act.
